Notably, on the same weekend the UIAA general assembly was also talking climate action in Banff. We look forward to a report from Stu Gray about the learnings. These topics stimulated some great conversations after the AGM and will be on the Board agenda in the months ahead.

The Aspiring Hut rebuild continues to progress at pace, with the second concrete pour being completed yesterday. The team have been doing a great job in testing circumstances. The first pour was a feat in organisation and logistics, with 4 concrete trucks, one chopper, six builders and other staff on site. The chopper completed 45 loads from Raspberry Creek carpark to the hut with a 7 minute turnaround and no incidents. This is a real credit to the planning of the contractors, pilot and volunteers on the ground, and we thank you! The timeline is a little behind, but once a good anchor has been established, we hope that the route onward will be of less

resistance. Famous last words? Maybe! Please continue to spread the word about the build as the fundraising effort is ongoing.

Finally, I would like to say a big thank you to the Board. It is one of the least recognised positions in the Club but takes a lot of time and thought to effectively serve. The Board meeting on Saturday was one of the most positive and forward-thinking meetings that I have attended during my time at the Club. The Board are committed to the future success of the Club and working hard to achieve this.
