Kia ora,

Welcome to the NZAC June Newsletter.

On May 29th, 1953, NZAC Club member Ed Hillary and Tenzing Norgay were the first to summit Mt Everest. The members of the Club were ecstatic. The editorial of the 1953 New Zealand Alpine Journal, written by Mr J.P. Glasgow was dedicated to the successful summit.

He noted that Club members, E.P.Hillary and W.G.Lowe, were part of the 1953 British Expedition.

The final two paragraphs read as follows:

"Our joy at this first ascent of Mount Everest is no less than our personal pleasure that a New Zealander, a member of this Club, a mountaineer for whom the Club was able to obtain the introduction to an Everest expedition, is one of the two who have stood on the summit of the world's highest mountain. New Zealand mountaineering has come of age. The name of Sir

Edmund Hillary will endure as a son of New Zealand, and his achievement as a tribute to the Southern Alps wherein he was trained as a mountaineer.

And so, with all mountaineers, with all New Zealanders, with all people everywhere who thrill to the story of human adventure and endeavour, The New Zealand Alpine Club joins in warmest congratulations to the successful 1953 British Everest Expedition."

Sir Edmund Hillary, at the time, was an active and engaged Club member. The Journal includes a comprehensive report on the 1952 British Himalayan Expedition jointly written by E.P. Hillary and W.G. Lowe. Sir Edmund was an Officer of the Club, serving on the Committee and he was also Vice Chairman of the Auckland Section. Later in 1953, he was awarded Life Membership to the New Zealand Alpine Club and went on to serve as Club President in 1965.

The newsletter has details of upcoming events that celebrate the 70year anniversary of Sir Ed and Tenzing Norgay's achievement.

You don't have to climb Mt Everest to be on the Board of the New Zealand Alpine Club. The Club is calling for nominations for four elected positions on the Board for a two-year term commencing in October 2023. Details of the commitment required, and ideal experience are found in the newsletter. We are looking for people who represent the diverse voice of our Club membership.
