

Unsupported Trip to South Pole

In November 2022 Richard and friend Gareth Andrews set off from the north coast of Berkner Island, on the shores of the Weddell Sea, each towing a 165kg sled with all the supplies and equipment they would need for an expedition to the South Pole. 66 days latter they reached the South pole, having endured howling winds, freezing temperatures and minimal visibility along the way.

They also carried equipment along that collected climate and meteorological data, which was continuously beamed to the Landsat 8 satellite – something never before done.

It will now be studied by scientists around the world, and Dr Stephenson hoped it would give them crucial insights into the planet's present climate and enable them to predict future climate behaviour – perhaps even help fight climate change.

I am still lost for words about this opportunity to go to South Georgia. I loved meeting the crew last weekend in Auckland, such a diverse huge amounts of knowledge, passion for nature and unique perspectives. We have experts in fields such as meteorology, healthcare, arts, education, advocacy and we all share dedication to exploration, discovery and conservation. I cannot wait to build friendships with these amazing humans!

We depart from Auckland International Airport as a team on the 28th of September this year. We will travel via Santiago and Punta Arenas, bunch from all over New Zealand. There is Chile to the Falkland Islands where we will hop aboard the Magellan Explorer operated by Antarctica21 for a 14 day voyage exploring South Georgia. On the expedition, we will cruise inflatable in Zodiac boats. drop us mountaineers off and pick us up, visit vast king penguin rookeries, seal covered beaches, and many important historic sites connected to Shackleton, including his final resting place.

This is the Trust's ninth Inspiring Explorers Expedition[™] following a crossing of South Georgia in 2015, an ascent of Mount Scott in Antarctica in 2017, crossing the Greenland ice cap in 2018, kayaking expeditions on the Antarctic Peninsula in 2019 and 2020, a New Zealand-based ski traverse in 2022, and skiing almost 1000km to the South Pole in 2022.



- Minimum hire is 2 days.
- When hiring the Avalanche set (transceiver, shovel, probe), please supply your own 1 x AA alkaline non-rechargeable battery.
- · Gear is hired with the expectation that it will be returned clean and tidy, if gear is lost or damaged, replacement cost will be charged
- · Gear can be reserved in advance by paying in full via bank transfer
- All gear must be paid for on booking.
