A big welcome to all new members and those who continue to participate in Club activities. Our section membership has risen since last year which reflects the growth in the Club as a whole. 230 section members puts us just above our pre Covid high point. This is great in general but I think it points to two main factors. We are retaining new members who come through the BSCC and climbers are moving to the Top of The South to enjoy the lifestyle on offer here.

While the snowpack has been slim for the most of the winter, the climbing is far from over with the spring season just kicking off. Over the year there have been many section members out and about, from overseas excursions to local trips. Notable has been the ice climbing season with some keen climbers out on ice crags many weekends. Some new ice discoveries in remote head basins have been reported.

Banff

The Banff Mountain Film Festival is the main annual fundraiser for the NZAC. Two successful screenings were held in Nelson this year. Thanks to Josh Knox and Neil Seaman for making this happen, as well as all those who volunteered on the two nights. I'd be interested in seeing a Banff screening in the Marlborough region next year too.

Instruction

Two Basic Snowcraft Courses have been run recently. Both with reasonable conditions and well attended. Thanks to all the instructors who make the courses possible. We have had a large waiting list for the last two years and women are now forming the larger part of applicants and participants. I'd like to see an additional or third BSCC run next winter. Vicky Shelling and Maree Holland attended instructor development and avalanche education courses this year. It has been so good to see young, enthusiastic ladies picking up important roles in the club.

If anyone would like to train as an instructor or you are already up to scratch with your fundamental mountaineering skills, then please make yourself known. It's a fun and rewarding job to take new climbers out in the hills for a weekend.

Trips

This year we saw more trips with more people. A good variety of trips have been run although most of them in short weather windows. Despite this, a number of valiant attempts didn't quite hit the intended summits. Trips aren't quite over for the year with a couple of trips such as Mt Adams, Gloriana Peak and a summer rock trip all on the cards before Christmas.

This year, we encountered our first significant incident on a Section trip. Accidents do happen and this is where our trip leaders and the effort they go to, to mitigate risks, shine through.

Thanks to those who lead trips year after year. This year we also saw a few new trip leaders step up which is always great. We always need more trip leaders, especially those interested in running easy social trips. There's club support for those who want to develop their leadership skills through training courses.

Also thanks to Hamish Brown for his role as Trips Coordinator. Hamish took on the role last year and established new systems that enabled trip leaders to get their paperwork done with less hassle. He is taking a break from the role so we are looking for a new Trip Coordinator. Anyone with a head for organisation and enthusiasm for getting people out in the hills should find this role a breeze

Stormy Time on Mt Arthur

On a stormy September Sunday four recent BSCC participants and an instructor headed up towards the Mt Arthur Hut.



A text from one concerned participant late in the evening inspired me to throw my chainsaw in the back of the vehicle. Shortly after this came in handy dealing with a large Macrocarpa tree that had fallen across the gravel road, with a frustrated local trying to head down into Motueka. It was quickly tidied up and dragged to the side of the road with the Landcruiser. Next stop, Kahurangi National Park.

We set off up towards the hut, buddy checking for any stray pack straps and oddly attached equipment. Once at the hut we put on wet weather gear and wandered up onto the ridge. With winds around 80km/h and forecast to climb to 120km/h, we discovered that a stable stance and balanced pace apply not only to snow travel but also on tussock ridges in extreme winds. We forged on as far as we were comfortable and experienced what it's like to not be able to talk to each other within a couple of metres before returning to the hut.

Unfortunately we didn't get much of a break from the weather man. However the participants definitely cemented the idea that when the going gets tough, that it always pays to go back to basics. A strong stance, balance and rhythm - the climber's mantra.
